EDELFRIED SCHNEIDER



Prof. Dr. W. Schneider became President of Accountancy Europe in December 2016, after he had joined its board in 2013. Priority tasks during his term will be to help adapting EU regulation to the needs of SMEs and advance the digitization of auditors' work. Edelfried is a long-term partner in the midsize auditing company Dr. Dienst & Partner. He was also Chairman of the Institute of Public Auditors in Germany (IdW) from 2011 until 2015. ALEXANDRE MAKARONIDIS



Alexandre Makaronidis, is a graduate of the School of Management at the Ludwig-Maximilians University of Munich and holds a Dr. oec. publ. in econometrics from the same University. Alexandre is the Head of TF EPSAS – European Public Sector Accounting Standards, European Commission - DG EUROSTAT. TF EPSAS is leading the Commission's work on European Public Sector Accounting Standards.

PETER C. LORSON



Prof. Dr. Peter C. Lorson holds the Chair on Financial Accounting, Auditing, Management Accounting and Control at the university of Rostock (a 598 year old university in the north of Germany at the Baltic Sea) since 2007. He is currently Dean of the Faculty of Economic and Social Sciences. His preferred research fields are public and private sector issues related to Financial & Management Accounting, Sustainability Accounting & Reporting and Integrated Reporting.

THOMAS MÜLLER-MARQUES BERGER



Thomas Müller-Marqués Berger started working in 1993 and since 2003 as partner at Ernst & Young. In 2004, he became director of the Ernst & Young Center of Competence for Governmental Accounting in Germany. Since 2009, he is the Global Head of International Public Sector Accounting and since 2012 Assurance Leader Government and Public Sector for EMEIA (Europe, Middle East, India and Africa) within Ernst & Young. He is member of various working committees of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Germany (IDW), e.g. the working committee ÖFA (Öffentliche Verwaltung und Unternehmen, public administration and companies). Since 2003 he has been a member and since 2012 he became Chairman of the Public Sector Committee of Accountancy Europe. He was a member of the IFAC IPSAS Board from 2009 until 2014. End of 2015, Thomas was appointed as inaugural Chairman of the new Consultative Advisory Group (CAG) to the IPSASB.

NEIL STEVENSON



Neil Stevenson has nearly 20 years of experience in the accounting and finance sectors. At the IIRC, he leads on developing a strong global brand for Integrated Reporting and key institutional relationships. Prior to joining the IIRC Neil was involved in the communications group that established the <IR> brand in 2010 and subsequently served on the IIRC Working Group which provided guidance on the development of the IIRC as a global organization and the International <IR> Framework. He was educated at the Universities of Cambridge and Leeds and is a Fellow of CIM.

PETER WELCH



Peter Welch is a Director at the European Court of Auditors, now leading audit in the areas of agriculture, energy and climate change, and until recently coordinating the ECA's assurance audits of the EU. Prior to joining the ECA he was employed by the UK National Audit Office, and spent time auditing UN bodies in Rome. He then acted as an international consultant with Bolivia's Audit body. He took a break from his career in audit to stand for election to the European Parliament in 2009 and the House of Commons in 2010. Peter is a Member of CIPFA and CIMA, and is one of CIPFA's representatives on the Public-Sector Group of the Accountancy Europe.

ALEXANDRA POPOVIC



Alexandra Popovic is an Audit Director at the Swedish National Audit Office (SNAO). Alexandra's main responsibilities has been to manage audits and sing audit opinions for several government entities, including the Governmental Consolidated Financial Statements and develop the offices audit methodology. She is also deeply involved in the development of international audit standards for the public sector, within the INTOSAI community as a member of the Forum for International Professional Pronouncements (FIPP), Professional Standard Committee (PSC) and Financial Audit and Accounting Subcommittee (FAAS). During 2013 – 2015 she also served as Technical Advisor for IAASB (International Audit and Assurance Standards Board). During her whole career, she has been engaged in capacity development projects supporting implementation of international standards in various regions and countries.

MANFRED KRAFF



Dr. Manfred Kraff, born in 1959, holds a degree in Public Administration and in Economics and a Ph.D. from the University of Freiburg. From 1983 to 1988 he worked for the European Commission (EC) and from 1988 to 2012 for the European Court of Auditors. In 2012, he returned to the EC as Deputy Director-General for budget and Accounting officer of the EC.
