
OVERVIEW: WHAT DO ACCOUNTANCY EUROPE MEMBERS DO FOR YP?

Almost 70% (35) of our 51 member bodies (MBs) responded to this survey. Please see the detailed responses below.


AGE

47 is the average age of MBs' members: the youngest in Malta (29) and Cyprus (35) and the oldest in Germany (53) and Spain (57). See a breakdown of European accountants in age groups below:



MB YP INITIATIVES:

The pie chart below summarises MBs' YP activities:



5 MBs indicated that they have no specific YP activities.

For the other **30** we found the following breakdown of YP activities:

10 MBs have a total of **9** dedicated YP organisations in 7 countries (Austria, Belgium, France, Italy, the Netherlands, Romania and Spain). These YP organisations relate to the MBs in different ways:

- 6 YP organisations (Austria, Belgium (2x), the Netherlands, Spain and Romania) are MB committees
- 3 YP organisations (France (2x) and Italy) are not directly related to MB, but they regularly interact.

Of the 20 MBs that do not have a dedicated YP organisation:

- **12** MBs serve YPs through a:
 - specific initiative; and / or
 - strategy to ensure YPs participate throughout their activities and governance structure
- 8 MBs do not have a specific YP initiative/strategy, but for their main activities for YP include
 - o organise content-based events (6 MBs)
 - support with qualification/traineeships (6 MBs)
 - organise networking events (4 MBs)
 - o participate throughout their activities (4 MBs)
 - provide input to professional institute (3 MBs)
 - o participate in governance process /leadership (2 MBs)
