During this time he founded or co-founded four businesses.

Francis Chittenden is a member of the Council of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), and chairs ACCAs UK Small Business Committee and Education Policy Committee. He is Chair of the FEE SMP Task Force. He is a Fellow and past President of the Institute for Small Business and Entrepreneurship, and co-author of the Manchester Business School Tax Index and the British Chambers of Commerce UK and EU Databases of Impact Assessments. He is also a member of the editorial boards of the International Small Business Journal and the Journal of Small Business and Enterprise Development.

He lectures, publishes and consults internationally on finance and the financial management of SMEs. He has completed research projects for ACCA, the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW), the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills and the British Chambers of Commerce. His current research interests include access to finance for owner-managed firms, cash flow management, capital investment decisions, the capital structure of SMEs and private equity finance.
