

# Submission Guidelines for Articles

- (1) Authors should be aware of the potential wide readership of this publication, some of whom may not have detailed knowledge of taxation concepts and practice. As the publication will form part of the public debate on the future of taxation, articles should represent the author's own viewpoint and should not presume certain backgrounds or mind-sets in readers or the publisher
- (2) Articles can represent the views of organisations or individuals. If the article is on a personal basis, we request that the contributor specify their position and the organisation with which they are associated, including, if necessary, a disclaimer that personal views do not represent the views of that organisation. Links to the contributor's website are welcome but self-promotion of a particular product or service will not be published.
- (3) We would appreciate articles of between 2 000 and 4 000 words. If contributors wish to submit an article in excess of the upper limit we would ask that they contact the FEE team in advance of submission to discuss its suitability.
- (4) The publication will be made available to the public free of charge by FEE to contribute to the ongoing public debate and, consequently, FEE will not pay any honorariums, royalties or other compensation to the authors for the publication, reproduction, translation or any other use of their article.
- (5) All contributions must be in English, submitted in a commonly used electronic format and should be sent to [paul.gisby@fee.be](mailto:paul.gisby@fee.be).
- (6) Authors grant FEE an irrevocable worldwide licence to publish the article, or parts thereof, and to make it available to the public, to reproduce the article, or parts thereof, in any printed form and in electronic format, including, but not limited to the use of the article on its website. The article will also be available for publication in the formats mentioned above by FEE's Member Bodies who have the right to translate the article into another language. This licence is granted for the entire duration of the copyright concerned and to the largest extent possible by virtue of the applicable law.
- (7) Authors will be free to use their article elsewhere but we would be very grateful if the original FEE publication could be referenced.
- (8) It is not our intention to change the viewpoint or context of any article received but we reserve the right to contact the author to discuss any issues, for instance, in relation to the clarity of an argument or of a form of words. For publishing purposes, FEE will also have the right to make minor adjustments to the content and lay-out of the article subject to consultation with the author. A final copy of the article in its intended published form will be sent to contributors prior to publication.
- (9) Whilst we are seeking frank and open opinions, we will reject articles referring to specific individuals or organisations that could be defamatory, offensive or otherwise inappropriate. If facts are included referring to specific individuals or organisations we insist that these facts are verified and that the sources are quoted. FEE will not be held liable for any views expressed in contributors' articles. In any case, authors acknowledge bearing the sole responsibility for the content of their contribution and the views expressed therein.
- (10) Authors guarantee that their contribution does not constitute an infringement in any way of third parties' intellectual property rights (in particular third parties' copyright).
- (11) As our aim is to present a comprehensive summary of the diversity of viewpoints on the topic, in terms of sector, geography and culture, FEE will retain full discretion as to which articles meet the selection criteria for publication and will actually be published.
- (12) Submission of an article implies consent by the author to all the terms and conditions listed above.
- (13) The publication of the compendium, as well as these terms and conditions and the rights and obligations of the authors and FEE resulting from their contribution shall be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with Belgian law. Any dispute between the authors and FEE under these terms and conditions will have to be first discussed in view of finding an amicable solution, including e.g. through mutually agreed arbitration, and in the absence of such solution, shall be submitted to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Belgian courts.
